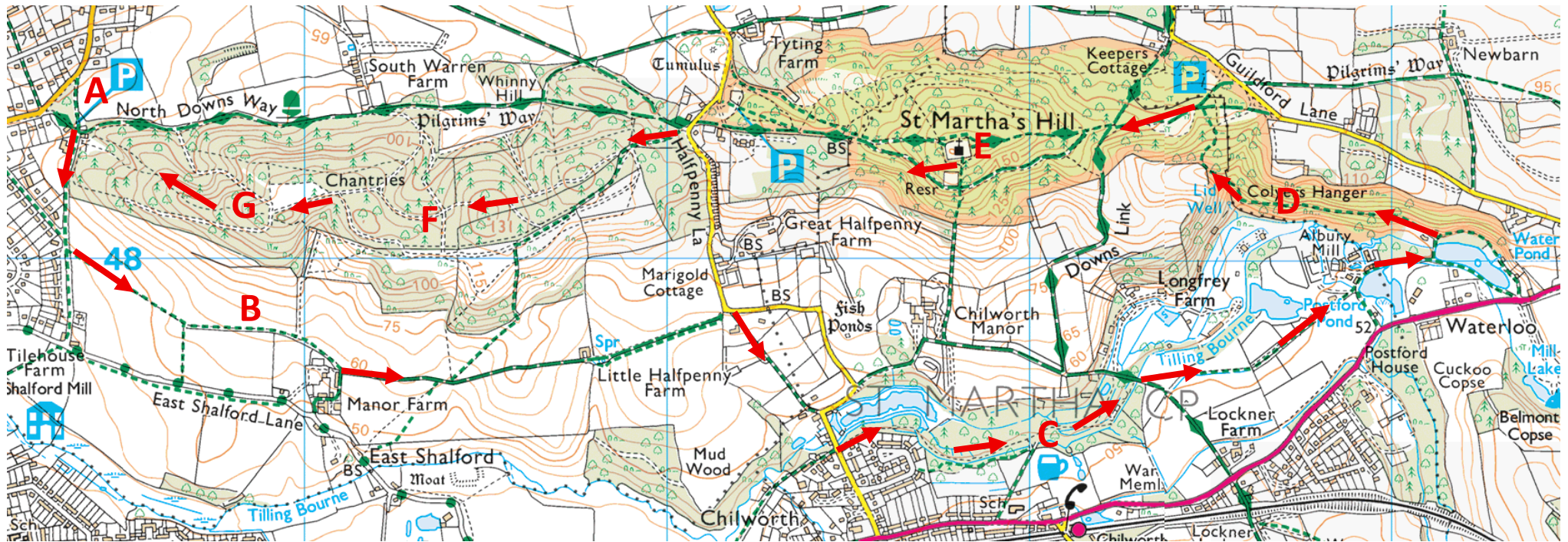


St Martha's Hill and Church circular walk



Approx 2.5 hours including a stop for lunch at St Martha's

[A] – Chantry/Chantries car park, small and so can easily be full on Saturdays. Some on-street parking nearby.

[B] – Beautiful start to the walk across open fields with Chantry Wood and St Martha's Hill to the left.

[C] – Chilworth gunpowder mills trail <https://www.stmartha-pc.gov.uk/pages-stmarthaparish/gunpowder/heritage-trail.php>

[D] – Through bluebell woods followed by steep path to the top of St Martha's Hill

[E] – St Martha's Church generally open Saturdays. Lots of south-facing seating. Grave of Yvonne Arnaud. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/St_Martha%27s_Hill

[F] – Chantry Wood. Paths are a bit haphazard, but keeping near to the left (south) edge of the wood means you stay in woodland all the way back to the carpark (rather than following the North Downs Way).

[G] – Cathedral Viewpoint (approx. location!)

There are a couple of places which can be rather muddy but should be ok if no significant rain.
